**Clues:**

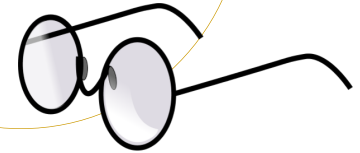


1. Read all standing signs and signs in cases for answers.
